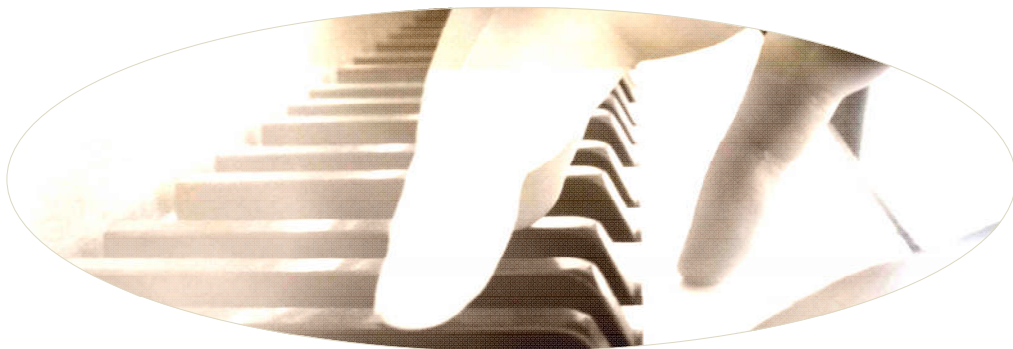

PIANO.
